SAFEGUARDING AND PREVENT

The service is strongly committed to practices that protect children, young people and adults from abuse, neglect or significant harm.

All Further Education providers have a duty to safeguard their learners: Prevent is about safeguarding our learners to keep them safe from being exploited by extremists.

The Prevent Duty is not about discouraging our learners from having political and religious views and concerns but rather it is about supporting them to use those concerns or act on them in non-extremist ways. We are fully committed to safeguarding you and protecting you from harm at all times.

The service also recognises that it has a responsibility to protect its staff from unfounded allegations of abuse.

We are committed to working with the local Safeguarding Partnerships to ensure the safeguarding of all our learners. Hull Training and Adult Education has a trained Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) and a Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead (DDSL) in each centre. They are responsible for supporting learners who have been abused, witnessed abuse, or been bullied or harassed, or disclose any specific safeguarding issues or concerns both within the service and external to the service.

HTAE support disclosures which may include:

- Housing / homelessness / sofa surfing
- Debt
- Substance misuse
- Mental health
- Period poverty
- Domestic abuse
- Modern slavery
- Sexual abuse
- Prevent
- County lines
- Self-harming
- Suicide risk
- Grooming

And any issue which the learner feels at risk of harm or just would like to talk to a member of staff for advice.

If a DSL / DDSL or a member of staff has abuse reported to them:

- Which took place in a Hull Training and Adult Education Service environment
- Which took place outside the service
- Which is reported by a third party
- Which is involving another member of staff, a learner or a volunteer

or if they witness abuse; staff / learner, volunteer / learner or learner / learner and any abuse involving children, they will follow the HTAE safeguarding procedures. Incidents or concerns will be reported to the DSL / DDSL in the first instance. The DSL is responsible for monitoring and managing incidents or concerns and liaising with external safeguarding agencies.

Learners should be aware that, in certain cases, confidentiality is not an option.

Where there would still be other adults or children at risk, staff are obliged to report abuse to the DSL / DDSL's.

HOW TO ENROL

Community Learning (CL) and Qualification (Q_) courses

To enrol on the majority of the Community Learning and Qualification courses you are required to attend an induction workshop. These will take place week commencing **Monday 12 September 2022**. At the induction workshops you will meet a member of staff to discuss the course, take an assessment to check that the course is the right one for you, and complete your enrolment. We look forward to meeting you on the day!

Full Cost (FC) courses

To enrol on any Full Cost courses a payment is required to secure your place. Not all courses are funded, or part funded, by the Department for Education, therefore we have a selection of courses for you that will run for leisure with associated costs.

CRECHE

Some Hull Training and Adult Education centres have creche facilities run by qualified and experienced creche supervisors, who are DBS checked. Opening times vary, so please check with your centre for further information and availability.

The Safeguarding and Creche Manager will ensure that:

- Clear safeguarding procedures are in place so that children using creche services are protected from abuse and neglect, including procedures for dealing with allegations against staff
- Staff are properly trained in recognising harm and how to refer concerns in accordance with the Hull Safeguarding Children's Partnership (HSCP) procedures
- All creche staff have an updated DBS enhanced check

Creche places are limited. If you need a place, please book before enrolling on your course. There is a small charge of £4.00 per session.

Method of Delivery for Hull Training and Adult Education

CL – Community Learning

Courses designed to develop skills for the future, through interests and enrichment activities. Our aim is to raise aspirations for you to succeed by offering a range of courses to suit all levels and abilities. 1-110

Q - Qualification Courses

FEES, CONCESSIONS AND FINANCIAL SUPPORT

CAN I PAY BY INSTALMENTS?

If the courses cost more than £100 you can pay by instalments. You will need to pay 50% of the course fee at enrolment. Please ask for further details at enrolment and note that you are still liable for the course fee even if you withdraw from the course.

UNEMPLOYED ADULTS IN RECEIPT OF MEANS TESTED BENEFIT

If you are unemployed, looking for work, and are in receipt of a means tested benefit all the qualification courses in this prospectus are free. You will need to sign a self-declaration form stating that you are looking for a job and provide supporting evidence to qualify for a government fully funded course.

FORMS OF PAYMENT

We accept debit / credit cards, we do not accept cheques for course fees.

DIGITAL SKILLS

All digital skills qualification courses are now free.

LEVEL 2 ENTITLEMENT

If you are aged 19–23 years old you may be entitled to free tuition if you do not already have a qualification at or above Level 2.

BASIC SKILLS

All basic skills courses in English and Meths are free - this includes English and Maths GCSE if you do not already have a grade A-C or grade 4 or higher.

LEARNERS ON A LOW INCOME

You do not have to pay any course fees if you meet both of the following criteria:

- You are in paid employment
- You earn less than £18,525 per annum.

You will need to provide proof of income, for example, this could be a wage slip within 3 months of the course start date, or a current employment contract, which states gross monthly / annual wages.

Fee remission under this category is at the discretion of the Service and must be claimed before the start of the course. Refunds will not be given after the start of the course.

REFUNDS

Refund of full fees are only given if:

- a class is cancelled by the Service and there is no suitable alternative, all fees are refunded
- the learner is unable to attend for medical reasons and has an appropriate medical certificate.

FREE QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADULTS

If you are 19 or over and do not already have a Level 3 qualification or higher, you can access a free Level 3 qualification. Level 3 is equivalent to an advanced technical certificate or diploma, or A levels.

You may also be able to get help to pay for childcare, travel and other costs.

A Level 3 qualification could help you:-

- Gain skills that employers value
- Improve your job prospects
- Earn a better wage

Skills Bootcamps in Hull and East Yorkshire

Skills Bootcamps are intensive, Level 3 to 5 or equivalent flexible training courses up to 16 weeks, with a guaranteed job interview (in the case of a new job). Skills Bootcamps will equip adults with technical skills that enable them to access in demand jobs, apprenticeships, new opportunities and an increased level of income over time (including for the self-employed).

If you like working with children and want to play a part in their education and well-being, this career could be ideal for you.

PREPARING TO WORK IN SCHOOLS - LEVEL 1 AWARD

This qualification is about gaining an insight into working in a learning environment, whether this is in a primary, secondary or special school. You will learn about the different types of schools in the education sector and how they are organised.

This classroom-based course will prepare you for further learning while developing an understanding of the teaching and learning environment in a school, how to support the well-being of children and young people and how young people develop basic skills including children's learning in and out of the classroom.
